












UPDATE ON UN75 ACTIVITIES IN MALAWI AS OF 26 NOVEMBER 2020

<p>UN75 Survey Staff Engagement</p> <p><i>March – Present</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> About 800 UN Staff in Malawi were mobilized to take the online UN75 Survey, including through Townhall meetings. Pictures of UN staff taking the survey were shared on social media platforms to encourage others to take the survey as well. 	
<p>UN75 Opinion Poll</p> <p><i>July</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Over 21 000 people in Malawi have shared their views about the future they want and how to achieve it through an SMS-based opinion polling platform called U-Report, reaching communities in remote areas. <p>UN75 Promotional Materials</p> <p><i>July – Aug</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> A video of the Resident Coordinator introducing UN75 in Malawi was released Social media assets and banners produced and utilised. 	
<p>UN75 Media Breakfast</p> <p><i>27 Sept</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> On 24 September, the Resident Coordinator and the UNCG chairperson hosted a UN75 dialogue with 13 journalists from different media houses in Malawi who talked about the world and Malawi they want. Areas they wanted to see change on include early marriages, elections management, the fight against corruption, women empowerment, better public finance management, better management of the environment and natural resources, and addressing climate change. The media personnel also took the UN75 online survey. 	
<p>UN75 Dialogue with Minister of Information and Youth</p> <p><i>7 Oct</i></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> On 7th October, the UN Resident Coordinator and the Minister of Information held a UN75 Dialogue together with youth representatives. The dialogue was covered live on a national Times TV and Radio, plus Facebook Live. It highlighted the role of youth in shaping a better future for all. Dialogue recording is here

<p>UN Staff Townhall Dialogue on UN75</p> <p>6 Nov</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> On 6th November, UN Staff in Malawi had a dialogue on the UN75 where they expressed their views on the future they want, the UN they want and how to achieve them.

<p>UN75 University Students Dialogue</p> <p>17 Nov</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> On 17th November, the UN Malawi held a UN75 Youth Dialogue with University Students event to discuss the future they want and how to achieve it. 63 university students from 8 universities/ colleges participated in the dialogue with the UN Country Team. The event was broadcast on Times TV and Radio as well as live on UN Malawi Facebook Live 	
<p>UN75 National Dialogue</p> <p>24 Nov</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> On 24th November, the Malawi President Dr. Lazarus Chakwera hosted a UN75 National Dialogue in Lilongwe with different stakeholders in Malawi's development process. The UN Deputy Secretary-General joined the dialogue session on global cooperation for development. The Malawi Permanent Representative to the UN in New York also followed the conversation virtually. The event was the climax of the national commemoration of the UN's 75th anniversary in Malawi. The program was broadcast live on Times TV, Radio and Facebook page, and covered across key national media outlets in Malawi, including newspapers: Nation and Times. 	
<p>UN75 Dialogue: Voices of Persons with Disabilities</p> <p>8 Dec</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> On 8 December, the UN Malawi will hold a UN75 Dialogue on the future that persons with disabilities in Malawi want and how to achieve it. The dialogue will also be part of the commemoration of the December 3 World Disability Day in Malawi. 	
<p>Offline UN75 Survey</p> <p>Nov and Dec</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> UN Malawi and Ministry of Information are conducting offline UN75 survey across 28 districts in Malawi, targeting 60,000 people. The views on the completed forms will be transferred onto the online UN75 online survey by a data entry team in the Ministry of Information. This activity is running in November and December.
